PRESBYTERY OF MISSOURI UNION: MINUTES OF STATED MEETING Tuesday, February 23, 2016

The Presbytery of Missouri Union met in a Stated Meeting on Tuesday, February 23, 2016, 9:30 a.m. at First Presbyterian Church, 400 Lakeview Road, Mexico, MO 65265.

Opening Songs were led by the moderator.

Welcome: Elder Georgia Reid, Moderator

The Moderator opened the meeting at 9:35 A.M.

A quorum [10% of Active Clergy and Congregations: 4 Teaching Elders, 7 congregations represented] was declared present by the Stated Clerk, Phil Olson.

The Moderator moved the adoption of the docket. Motion passed.

The Moderator received joys and concerns that were expressed by several of commissioners.

The Stated Clerk read the Necrology Report for 2015 [Appendix A].

The Clerk also remembered the Rev. Hal LeMert, Jr., who entered the Church Triumphant on November 11, 2015. These joys and concerns were incorporated into the opening prayer.

The Moderator called for first-time Commissioners in attendance to be introduced and welcomed by the Presbytery.

The Minutes of the October 29, 2015 Stated Meeting were received as corrected.

Upon Motion, the Presbytery approved the amendment [Appendix B] for Standing Rules, 4.40.

Upon Motion, the Presbytery accepted the resignation of the Rev. Michael Lewton as Vice Moderator.

The Clerk reported the Presbytery has 64 member congregations, 32 active Teaching elders and 26 Honorably Retired / Inactive Teaching Elders. A quorum for Presbytery meetings is: 7 congregations represented by commissioners, and 4 active teaching elders.

The Clerk presented Amendments to the Standing Rules for First Reading [Appendix B]

Presbytery Administrative Assistant Angela Pool presented awards and gifts to Clerks of Session for their work in reported annual statistics. She also invited congregation to submit nominations for the Evelyn Bedell Awards, which will be presented at the next Presbytery meeting.

Committee on Ministry Report:Rev. Mary Ellen Waychoff Upon Motion, the Presbytery:

voted to extend through 2016 the requirement of Boundaries Training for all pastors (CREs and HR pastors serving MUP churches included) by 2015 and every three years after that date. When training is completed, a copy of certificate of completion *must be* sent to the Presbytery Office for Presbytery files.

RATIONAL: Many members of the Presbytery were unable to attend one of the events sponsored by the UCC, Christian Church (Disciples of Christ), or the United Methodist Church. COM is looking into sponsoring an event each year to add another option.

Amendment to the Standing Rules: for vote

The Presbytery Council moves to amend Standing Rules, "4.40 Committee on Ministry (COM)" from reading:

The Committee on Ministry shall be composed of twelve (12) ministers and twelve (12) elders, elected by the presbytery to staggered three (3) year terms for a maximum of two (2) consecutive terms of three (3) years each.

to read:

The Committee on Ministry shall be composed of 21 members, divided as evenly as possible between Teaching and Ruling Elders, elected by the presbytery to staggered three (3) year terms, serving a maximum of 6 consecutive years.

Amendments to the Standing Rules: first reading

- 1. The Presbytery Council moves to amend Standing Rules, "4.10a, 4.30 & 4.31 to replace "Commissioned Lay Pastor" with "Commissioned Ruling Elder
- 2. The Presbytery Council moves to amend Standing Rules by deleting 4.12a [Communication Committee] and 4.12b [Communication Committee Purpose], and renumbering the Standing Rules accordingly
- .3. The Presbytery Council moves to amend Standing Rules 4.10a [Presbytery Council] by deleting "Nominations Committee" and "Communications" from the list of Council members.
